-Of course I am, Mom, they are my best friends! – her eyes shining bright. Sometime later, they arrived at her school, and Charlotte ran to hug her friends.

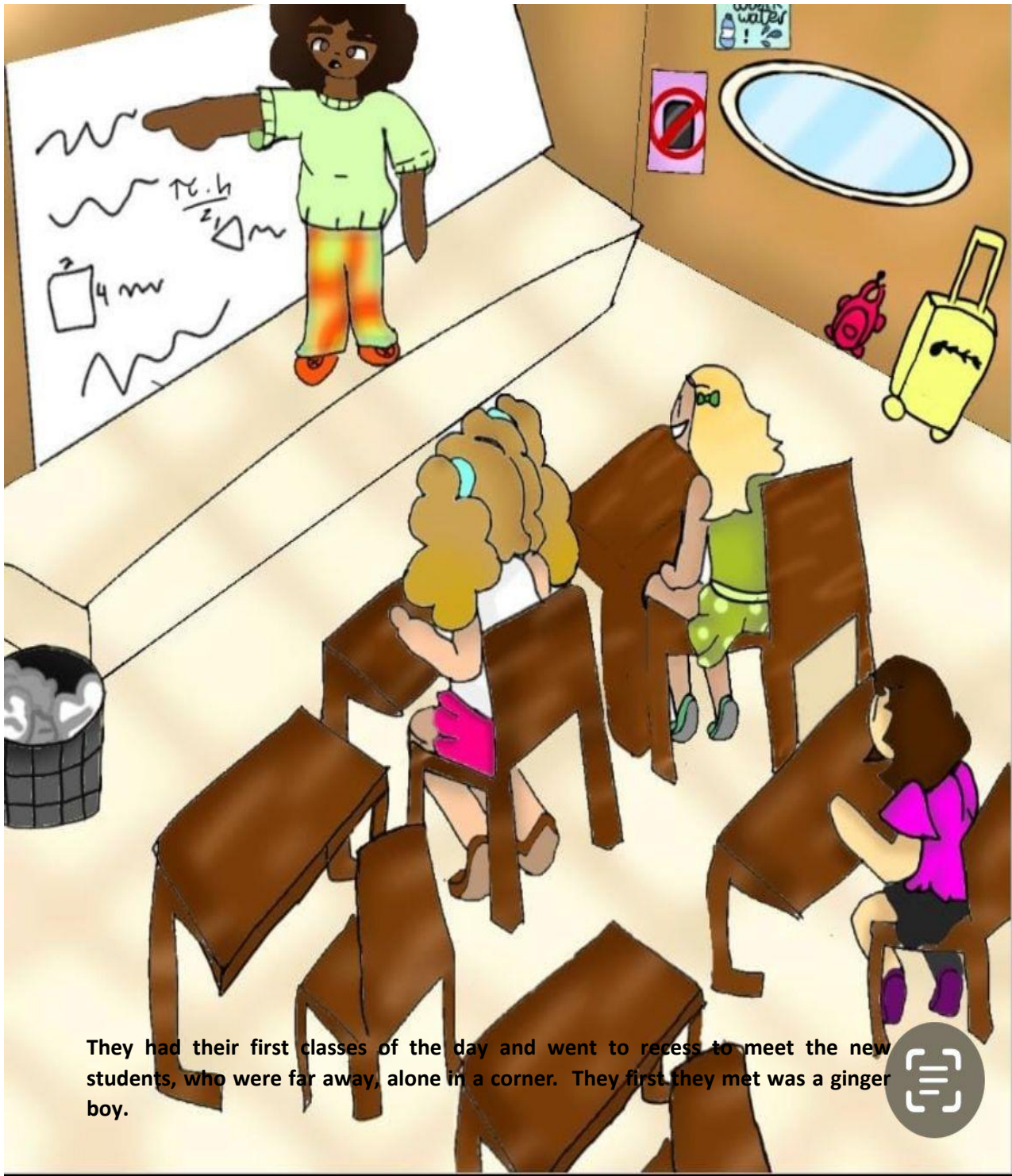


-Charlotte! I missed you! – said Victoria, opening her arms.

-Tata, Vivi, I missed you so much! – said Charlotte, a little before the bell rang, and they had to go to their classroom.





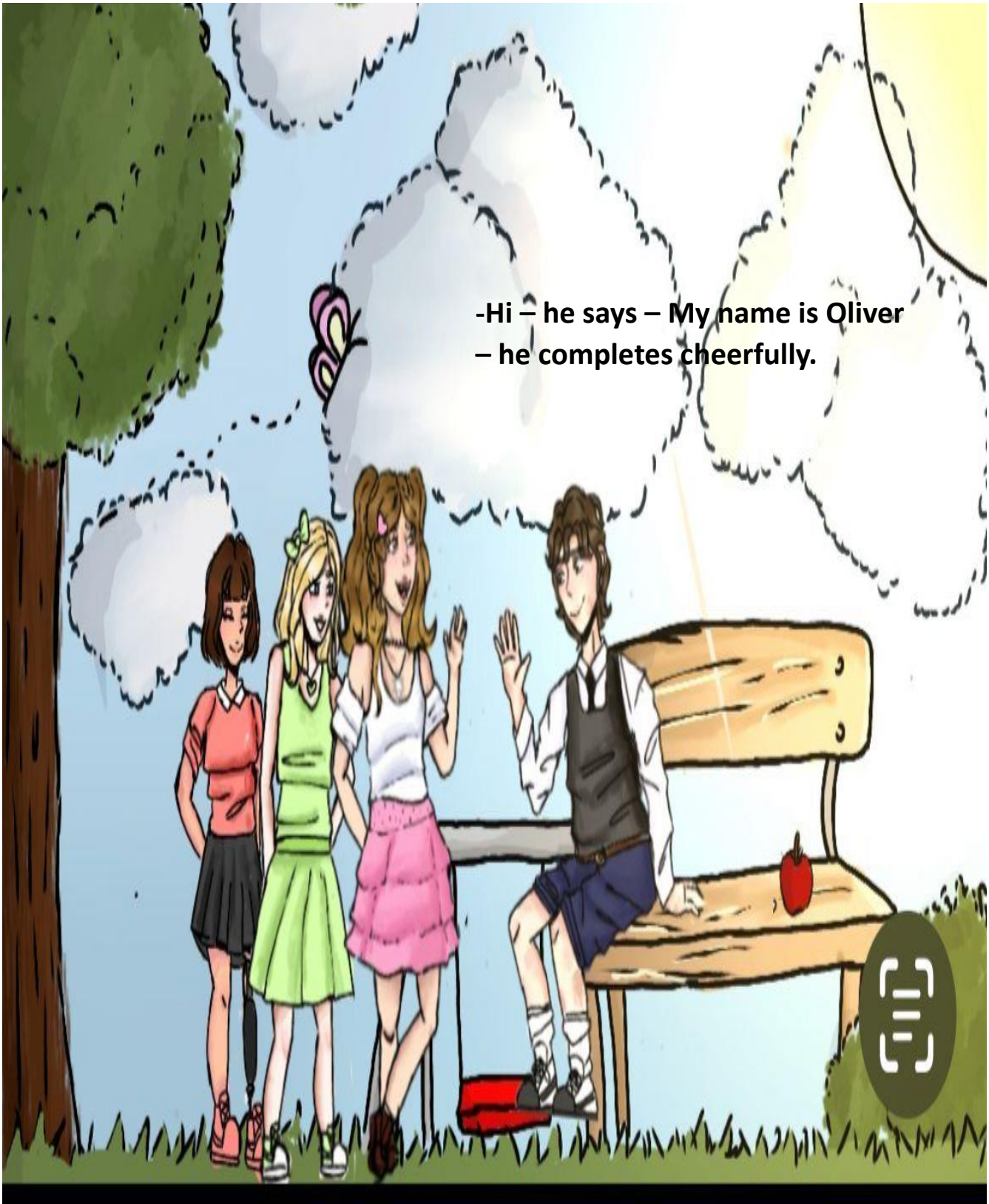
They had their first classes of the day and went to recess to meet the new students, who were far away, alone in a corner. They first they met was a ginger boy.
